## **5.0 ANNUAL REPORT 2014 – 2015:** President, Andrew Simpson

## **EVENTS AND SEMINARS**

Our ability to provide seminars and other events (eg this AGM) has been helped considerably by the sponsorship the Association has been able to secure in the past year, with the assistance of Heidi Crawford. Details of sponsors are given later in this report.

### **ACSE and IStructE**

The ACSE and IStructE continued to work together during 2014-2015. Our reciprocal agreement means that all ACSE members are invited to attend all IStructE seminars. A member of IStructE continues to be invited to be a member of the judging panel for the ACSE Structural engineering excellence awards.

ACSE President, Andrew Simpson took the opportunity of meeting with IStructE's President and Chief Executive at a recent seminar that he attended.

## **Annual Seminar**

## **ACSE Excellence Awards**

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2015

#### 1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the company is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the constitution and the needs of members. The company is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the requirements of the company's constitution and the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous year unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

### **Accounting Policies**

### (a) Income Tax

In accordance with Section 6-5 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997* the company is required to calculate its taxable income in accordance with the mutuality principle whereby the company is only taxed on non-member income.

## (b) Cash and cash equivalents

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of two months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

### (c) Revenue

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers. Membership subscriptions are recognised from the date the membership is accepted and/or renewed. Donations, appeals, sponsorships and bequests are recognised as received. Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial asset.

### (d) Comparative Figures

Comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year where required by accounting standards or as a result of changes in accounting policy.
