Weds 25 OCTOBER - Annual Golf Day

Thurs 16 NOVEMBER – Annual General Meeting

Last year the ACSE trialled a different venue in the CBD to hold the AGM but found it to be inappropriate. Chloe researched many options and it was decided this year, to move back to the Kirribilli Club.

The Board all took 10% of the members list to personally contact them and encourage attendance.

Weds 13 DECEMBER - Christmas Trivia Night

In December 2016 the first Christmas Trivia night was held at the Woolloomooloo Hotel. It was a very successful event which quickly sold out with more wanting to attend. The ticket price was set too low with a subsidy from ACSE to trial the event. The event will be repeated in 2017 with extra tables available and an increased ticket price to ensure that all costs are covered.

4. Projects

Early in the year the Board agreed to rebrand the Association. It is believed that the existing logo has been in use since the inception of the association!

The Board agreed to draw down \$10,000 for the term deposit to fund a new logo, new administration templates and a new website. The new website and logo will be launched at the AGM.

New Logo

Chloe sourced quotes from two professional freelance graphic designers and asked one of them to submit a concept for the Board to review. In fact, everyone liked the initial concept so much that only a few minor tweaks were needed to finalise the design.

A suite of templates including different size formats (for letterheads, social media, invoices etc) of the logo, new certificates and Powerpoint slides were rolled out and a new Brand Style Guide was provided.

New Website

Chloe sourced quotes from two companies, one being Cornerstone, the company that put together the previous ACSE website and the other being an independent digital marketing specialist called Marzipan Media. The Board voted to go with the cheaper provider, Marzipan Media.

Chloe has managed the project, employing a professional copywriter to reduce and streamline the old content and then compiling all the other required elements. The new website includes some updated plug-ins and widgets which will greatly improve the efficiency of the association, particularly for the administration, registration and payment for events. The primary goal was to keep visitors on our



website rather than clicking away to third-party providers. There will also be a reduction in the booking fees for our ticketed events and the new format will drive more traffic to the website as a whole. Other features such as the membership application and mailing list subscription will be automated within the website.

5. Education

University Lecture Program

The program ran again in 2017 with Sydney University, who were appreciative of the support, however the curriculum has been reformed and this is the last year the subject will run.

Two lectures were given this year and three other presenters that agreed to participate did not go ahead with their lectures.

In 2017 the Board finalised Practice Paper number 20 *Safety in Design.* This was made available to members via the Spring Newsletter in September.

Practice Paper number 24 *Peer Reviews* will be circulated at the AGM with an invitation to attend a forum in December to give feedback. The paper will then be finalised by the end of the year.

7. Membership
